We welcome applicants from different areas of psychology whose work addresses these topics. **In their application materials, applicants should address – and provide objective indicators of -- which theme (well-being or self-regulation) their work advances, and how.**

Evidence of superior scholarship, excellent teaching ability, and strong methodological skills are required. The successful candidate will teach courses in their area(s) of expertise as well as more general courses at the undergraduate and/or graduate level, conduct programmatic research, supervise undergraduate and graduate student research, and be committed to diversity and inclusion as core values.
